
Curriculum Vision



All curriculum planning focuses on the key skills of communication, cognition, physical development and self-care and independence, and is informed by a developmental perspective.

Rights of the child are central

Class timetables are constructed around the principle that every moment of the school day is a learning opportunity. Each aspect of school life is a planned learning experience, and linked to PLIMS. 'A 'Creative Curriculum', which promotes building connections, problem solving skills, and coherence, is alive in every classroom, and ensures ongoing opportunities for active cross-curricular and contextualised learning.

Curriculum Intent

Early Years Curriculum Experience and Investigate

Learners follow the EYFS curriculum throughout Early Years and Year 1. This is a developmental curriculum, which plays a diagnostic role in establishing which of the three Orchard's curricula and Pathways the children begin in Year 2. The three prime areas of the core EYFS curriculum are Communication and Language, Physical Development and Personal, Social and Emotional Development.
