



## Sports Premium Statement 2019/20

The Orchards School Sport Premium Statement of Intent 2019-20

The government has maintained the high level of funding for the academic year 2019-20 to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools

The focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the vision that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding. Funding is based on numbers of pupils in years 1-6 and we will receive £16,320 .

Vision for Primary PE and Sport Premium: All pupils will leave primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

Objective: To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport measured against the following 5 key indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and active healthy lifestyles
2. Raising the profile of PE and sport across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increasing confidence, knowledge and skills of staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Increasing participation in competitive school sports.
5. Expanding the growth in the range of traditional and alternative sporting activities offered to pupils
